### TALLOW FUNDRAISER

Tallow is a boy that attends Mount Colah PS. We have decided that we are going to try and raise some money for him to help with further medical costs. His favourite colour is green. So on Wednesday 13th November, there will be Green Spider drinks on sale (\$1.00 each) at lunch and all money will go towards helping Tallow.

He arrived into this world 10 weeks earlier than expected. A few incidents led to a lack of oxygen to his little brain at birth. This has caused some damage to the brain and has resulted with his physical challenges called 'Cerebral Palsy Spastic Diaplegia'.

On top of this Tallow also presented with high lactates in his blood not long after birth, which indicated he had some type of metabolic condition known as mitochondrial disease, or 'mito'. In layman's terms this means in some part of the body the energy is not being passed through efficiently in the mitochondria. Because there is mitochondria cells in every part of the body mitochondrial diseases can vary in severity enormously from each individual and can affect any part of the body. It is also a progressive disease meaning it gets worse and worse and in many severe cases it is fatal.

Despite his challenges, Tallow is one of the most happy, social and fun-loving people you will meet. He has a large zest for life and his cheerfulness is infectious.


